'Provision for pupils with additional learning needs (ALN) and complex social and emotional needs is a strength of the school.'

This Year we have been running 2 Nurture provision rooms, one for the children on Lloyds Lane site, the other for children on Chapel Lane site to access in the afternoons. Within these settings the children have the opportunity to develop their social, emotional and behaviour skills following personal targets with access to specialised resources such as ELSA and Boxall.

Ysgol Y Waun prides itself on providing an environment which is accessible to all pupils regardless of educational and/ or physical needs. We have an 'Equality Policy' and 'Action Plan' which is reviewed by our Governing Body. Actions detailed within the plan aim to provide all pupils with 'equal access' to school opportunities.
